Wednesday, June 20, 2018, devastation, destruction and sadly, death, hit Bridgeville Borough. In a matter of minutes torrential rains caused mass flooding resulting in our First Responders quickly moving into action. Our Volunteer Fire Department, our Police Department and EMS along with Swift Water Rescue Teams sprung into action, safely evacuating many from their homes along the flooded streets. Our Public Works Department sprung into action (after saving what they could at the Borough Building) using manpower and machinery to remove debris and begin clean up of our Borough.

The storm wreaked havoc on many homes, businesses and organizations, displacing families and interrupting business operations. Sadly, some homes and businesses are not repairable.

The outpouring of help was overwhelming - from neighbors, friends and families, to complete strangers descending on our Borough to help us in our hours of need. Help came from all corners of our state as well as neighboring states. Everyone pulled together to help those in need, doing whatever they could to let those impacted know that they were not alone. Bridgeville's greatest resource is it's people, hard-working, caring and compassionate.

Area churches opened their doors and organized donation drives for furnishings and household items; cleaning supplies; food and clothing; they served meals and offered showers and emotional support. Local restaurants opened their hearts and doors, feeding those impacted and those working to clean up; volunteers and church teams walked the affected streets distributing food and water as well as cleaning supplies. Businesses stepped forward and offered help in supplies, repairs and what they could. Social Agencies descended on our borough offering resource help, support and guidance. Fundraisers have been and continue to be held as well as monetary donations being collected. Once all fundraising and donations have been finalized, the amount will be distributed equally among those impacted, based on the list of homes, organizations and businesses compiled.

"Bridgeville Strong" became our motto! We extend our heartfelt thanks to all who pitched in to clean up mud, muck and debris, fed and clothed; those who offered prayers and emotional support and helped in any way - your efforts have not gone unnoticed. The list is endless and while we would love to list all we know, we wouldn't want to unintentionally miss a name; we are mindful of the fact that those who helped, didn't do it for thanks, they did it because they care!

We still have a long way to go, but be assured we'll get there. Local Officials, Borough Administration, County, State and Federal representatives are working hard to obtain answers and a solution, meetings with the Army Corp. of Engineers have been on-going.

Bridgeville Borough Administration stands ready to offer assistance and guidance in any way within their power. Please reach out and ask questions about where to turn for outside help, if you are concerned about rumors you have heard, about what's going on; what may be the next step.

The Third Annual Ron Schott Memorial Softball Tournament will be held Sept. 15 at the Bridgeville Athletic Association field in Chartiers Park.

The tournament is part of an all-day memorial celebration and family picnic to honor Ron Schott, a Bridgeville resident who passed away in 2014. Activities include food and drinks for sale, live music, a Chinese auction, a 50-50 drawing, and games such as corn hole and bocce. The softball tournament will begin at 8 a.m. and continue throughout the day on the large field at Chartiers Park. Net proceeds will be used for Chartiers Valley High School scholarships, the Bridgeville Athletic Association and other community needs. Tim Wesley, a member of the planning committee for the event, said: “We continue to honor Ron each year with a very successful tournament, and we’re excited to host another event this year. Ron was a difference-maker, not just for his family and friends, but for the entire Bridgeville community. With the softball tournament as the centerpiece, we’re planning another event that will make a difference, too.”

Earlier this year, the scholarship committee awarded the second Ron Schott Memorial Scholarships to CVHS student Robert Richardson. Two scholarships are expected to be awarded next year to CVHS seniors who will pursue further education at a trade school or university. Scholarship recipients will be chosen based on academic record, school and community activities, and an essay describing their passion for helping others. Other donations have included defibrillators for Chartiers Park in Bridgeville and Skookum Field in Mt. Washington, a new scoreboard for the Bridgeville Athletic Association and financial support for the Spring Creek Volunteer Fire Department first responders.

Chartiers Center, a non-profit organization, provides **Substance Abuse Outpatient Services** to adolescents and adults **age 12 and older** who demonstrate a need for substance abuse treatment. This includes mandated and or court ordered treatment for DUI and other legal infractions. The consumers of these services may also be diagnosed with a co-occurring mental health disorder.

Outpatient treatment services include counseling, Vivitrol treatment (Vivitrol is a new, medically assisted treatment that is shown to have significant outcomes) and/or individual and group therapy sessions at Chartiers' Substance Abuse Outpatient Program. The program length will vary based on the needs and the person's progress in treatment. Should the need arise for a higher level of care, Chartiers will make the necessary contacts and referrals to ensure a smooth transition to an inpatient program or hospital.

FAMILY SUPPORT GROUP

For families and friends that have loved ones struggling with addiction there is a Family Support Group that meets the first Monday of each month from 5:00PM - 6:00PM. The group will offer support, education and resources to assist families and friends in the community. There is no cost, all are welcome! 

Second Reminder from Anne Marie Parisi, Real Estate Tax Collector, 412-221-6055 Bridgeville Borough Real Estate Tax and CV School District Tax

2018 Real Estate Tax time is now. Taxpayers are able to pay the CV School District tax in quarterly installments (1/4 of the Face Amount) on the following dates:

October 15 — December 15 — February 15 — April 15.

If you do not pay by the discount date of August 31st, or by the Face Date of October 31st, it is recommended that you take advantage of the installment plan. If the school taxes are not paid by the end of December, the unpaid taxes are turned over to the lien Tax Collector and an additional 10% penalty, plus costs, will be added to the tax bill. ***Bridgeville Borough has no control over school tax increases made by CV School Directors***

The Bridgeville Borough tax remains the same as indicated on the tax statement. Please include a self-addressed, stamped envelope when paying your taxes in order to receive your paid receipts in a timely manner.



Sweep your leaves in a pile at the curb for the sweeper to pickup. Remember to be cautious about running vehicles nearby as this can pose a fire hazard.

Brush Grinder program runs in November (and April) following the street sweeper schedule. Trimmings and limbs will be accepted and are to be placed at the curb for pick up.

Logs must be no larger than 12 inches in diameter. All brush material must be free and clear of roots and dirt as this is a safety hazard for our public workmen.
