Members of Council and Mayor,

Below is a summary of noteworthy Borough affairs and projects. Should you have any questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to ask.

CAPITAL PROJECTS:

 See attached detailed Project Update Log. Updates for the month are noted in red font.

ADMINISTRATION AND FINANCE:

- Grant Projects (Grant Log Attached):
 - Chartiers Park Fitness Trail Project Act 13 DCED Greenways, Trails and Recreation Grant completed, seeking \$250,000 for the project. Application submitted.
 - State Blight Removal Grant awarded \$74,520 to demolish four residential properties.
- Insurance Claims / Matters:
 - Workers Compensation Safety Committee met on May 20th. Committee Members received annual state training from State Workers Fund Representative that day.
 - W/C Claim on June 4th two police officers were injured while removing a fallen tree from Bower Hill Road. One officer received two stitches to his mouth. Minor injuries, no loss of work.
- New resident packets sent to all new home buyers for the prior month, information based off real estate transfer records.
- Right to Know Requests (4) copies of recent Tax Collector's report, copier equipment leases, permit records and the Police CBA.
- Budget to Actual review of all funds is routinely monitored, funds are performing well.
- Completed the Sustainable Pittsburgh Community Sustainability Assessment, the Borough achieved a silver score. This will assist the Borough with future grant requests to the state.

CODE ENFORCEMENT / ZONING / PLANNING:

- Detailed Zoning / Code Enforcement report attached summarizing complaints, permits and affairs.
- Attended Planning Commission meeting on May 24th.
- Active Transportation Plan: four proposals received and distributed to Planning Commission and Council members. Interviews set for the week of June 14th.
- Comprehensive Plan Project follow up questions sent to all six firms, responses due back June 14th. Responses to be graded, scaled and firms short listed so that interviews can be scheduled in July.

PUBLIC WORKS:

- Trash / Recycling Collections:
 - Complaints are being monitored and I talk to their Route Supervisor each Friday to coordinate any issues. No major issues this past month.
- Street Opening Permits Restoration reviews of all openings since last fall has been completed and restoration orders sent out to PAWC and Columbia Gas Co.
- Borough Building Roof Replacement Project work started week of June 7th.
- Route 50 Widening / Bridge Replacement Project attended utility relocation coordination meeting with contractors on May 27th. Work to start soon.
- Chartiers Creek Back Channel Gravel Bar Removals:
 - At McLaughlin Run Public Works completed project week of June 1st.
- 2021 Road Program: work completed with exception of Bower Hill Road Base Repairs.
- Chartiers Street Slope Repair PENNDOT 2024 Project, met with drilling company and PENNDOT on June 9th, they will be completing core drilling in Chartiers Park near the main driveway.
- Bower Hill Road Crosswalk at Commercial St. DPW installed the crosswalk, pedestrian sign and we were able to get five in-the-street pedestrian crossing signs from PENNDOT at no charge.
- Callout / Call off Board to better coordinate overtime callouts and vacation time scheduling we added a callout / call off board in the DPW breakroom.

- McLaughlin Run Park
 - Paving completed (Youngblood Contract)
 - Punchlist items remain on Sciarretti contract, line painting, landscaping, and finishing touches being completed.



LSSE submitted the Annual Progress Report on September 30, 2020. LSSE to meet with Staff to review PRP Plan to lessen required maintenance for PRP compliance and review Borough MS4 files in preparation of DEP Inspection.
- Stormwater Separators: LSSE completed surveys. LSSE preparing bid documents and final design plans. Project opened on May 5, 2021. Work was awarded to Independent Enterprises, Inc. in the amount of \$74,855.00 (Base Bid and Add Alternate Nos. 1 and 2). 

Contract Documents were transmitted to the Borough for execution on April 26, 2021. Pre-Construction meeting held on April 29, 2021. LSSE transmitted Change Order No. 1 to the Borough for execution on May 26, 2021; this change order was prepared to include Add Alternate No. 3 – McLaughlin Run Park Parking Lot to the Contract (increase of \$67,416.25). LSSE transmitted Change Order No. 2 to the Contractor for execution on May 26, 2021; this change order was prepared to include additional paving on Bower Hill Road. 2021 Road Paving Completed and Park paving complete. Bower Hill still to be completed. Final walkthrough to be scheduled with Borough and a coordination meeting for Bower Hill traffic control the same day with Contractor.

- Jane Way Access Project (GEDF Grant, awarded amount of \$425,000.00, part of flood mitigation projects): Bids were opened on October 8, 2020. LSSE provided County a location map; the Environmental Review was approved by the County on July 30, 2020. Work was awarded to LM&R Excavating, LLC in the amount of \$273,500.00 as noted in letter dated October 14, 2020. LSSE issued letter dated May 21, 2021 noting field observations that are outstanding. Contractor reseeded areas that vegetation did not establish.
- McLaughlin Run Park Phase II: Work was awarded to Sciarretti Site Development & Paving Co., Inc. in the amount of \$418,082.54 (Base Bid and Add Alternate No. 2) as noted in letter dated July 22, 2020. LSSE transmitted Change Order No. 1 to Borough for execution on October 8, 2020; this Change Order was prepared to adjust contract amount to install 8' long guiderail posts along the stream bank. Work beginning week of June 7, 2021.




