BRIDGEVILLE BOROUGH HAS BEEN WORKING WITH MACKIN ENGINEERS & CONSULTANTS OVER THE PAST YEAR TO UPDATE THE BOROUGH'S COMPREHENSIVE PLAN. WHICH WAS LAST DEVELOPED IN 2005.

A COMPREHENSIVE PLAN PROVIDES A VISION FOR THE FUTURE OF THE COMMUNITY ALONG WITH THE STEPS NEEDED TO TURN THE VISION INTO A REALITY.

THE PROCESS has been designed to provide as many opportunities as possible for the residents, business owners and other Bridgeville stakeholders to become involved in developing the plan. The project has included regular meetings with a Comprehensive Plan Steering Committee, public surveys, stakeholder outreach, a downtown/business development focus group and a public input

McLaughlin Run Road Bridge to be Replaced in 2025

PENNDOT has released its preliminary plans for the 2025 replacement of the McLaughlin Run Road Bridge over the creek near the park's entrance. The goal of this project is to replace the existing bridge on the same alignment. The project also includes minor roadway-approach work, drainage and guiderail updates/upgrades, signage, and pavement markings. Construction to improve portions of Werner Avenue and repair landslides are scheduled to start on August 1st. This project is under contract with A. Merante Construction, with most of the project being funded by American Rescue Act funding and grant funding from the State.

Spring 2023 in Bridgeville sure had its share of construction projects, many of such are now complete. Thanks for your help and cooperation. Pictured below are completed projects and improvements including the new playground and lighting upgrades within Chartiers Park, road paving of Greenwood Place, Perrett Street, and Laurel Street, the widening of Chartiers Street, the new 7-lane south end bridge, Union St. landslide repairs, sanitary sewer maintenance throughout the town and the installation of the final phase of backflow preventors at flood prone properties along McLaughlin Run

During the month of April, Greg Allott was promoted to Public Works Foreman. Greg previously served as the Department's Assistant Foreman, Mechanic and has worked for the Borough since 2013. The Department also welcomed new hire Greg Totin.

Each year the Pennsylvania State Association of Boroughs (PSAB) recognizes boroughs for going above and beyond in many categories. The members of Bridgeville Council and the Mayor have worked very hard to establish a level of communication that reaches as many people as possible. We have used several different platforms to educate our residents on all the things that are happening in our town. Bridgeville received the PSAB First Place Award for our newsletter and for "effective communication in our community".

April 10, 2023 The Council & Mayor:

- •Awarded 2023 Road Improvement Program to Youngblood Paving, Inc. in a contract amount of \$269,054.20.
- •Appointed Michael Neely to the Bridgeville Parking Authority Board of Directors.
- •Hired Gregory Totin as a Laborer within the Public Works Department.
- •Appointed Gregory Allott to the position of Public Works Department Foreman
- Partnered with Tree Pittsburgh to plant trees in the fall on Baldwin Street.

May 8, 2023 The Council & Mayor:

- Authorized the Manager to apply for a Flood Mitigation Grant for the Commercial St. Culvert Replacement Project.
- •Entered into agreement with PENNDOT to construct pedestrian bump-outs at specific corners on Bank Street in 2024.
- Awarded 2023 Sanitary Sewer O&M CCTV Program contract to Robinson Pipe Cleaning Company in the amount of \$36,010.
- •Accepted 2022 Borough Audit Report.
- •Granted Right of Way to PENNDOT in front of McLaughlin Run Park for a 2025 project to replace the bridge over the creek.

June 12, 2023 The Council & Mayor:

- Authorized the Manager to apply for a grant to reconstruct and complete the walking trail at Chartiers Park.
- •Closed out multiple recently completed projects including: Triangle Park ADA Walkways, Baldwin & Margaret Street Demolitions, 2023 Roadway Improvements Program, Chartiers Park Playground and Union Street Landslide Repair Projects.
- Discussed a proposed zoning amendment received from the Planning Commission regarding the placement of off-street parking pads in residential districts.
