Learn CPR and Save a Life!

At the September Council Meeting, the Mayor and members of the Borough Council recognized everyone that was involved in the “Chain of Survival” that helped save a delivery driver’s life on June 13, 2024 on Calvert Street. Recognized with a Proclamation and a service pin were Bridgeville citizens Mark Macala and Senator Devlin Robinson for their quick actions that started CPR and called 9-1-1, Bridgeville Fire Chief Ray Costain, SouthBridge EMS Paramedic Mark Succeralli, EMT Joshua Hankins, EMS Chief Dan Miller, Police Chief Chad King – all for their emergency care at the scene, and the St. Clair Hospital Emergency Department staff for their resuscitation efforts that ultimately saved the patient’s life.

A seamless transition in the links of the Chain of Survival which includes: activation of EMS, high quality CPR, defibrillation, advanced resuscitation, post-cardiac arrest care and recovery, all came together on June 13th, and through everyone doing their very best, this teamwork enabled a life to be saved!

Clear walkways make our sidewalks safer for everyone, including our community workers, like postal carriers, emergency services, and trash collectors.

Volunteer to be a Snow Angel

As a Snow Angel, you will be paired with a resident in need located within a 10-minute walk from your residence. Bridgeville Borough will confirm all the details with your match as a match is made. If you are willing to help more than one neighbor, please let us know on the registration form.

Request help from a Snow Angel

If you are at least 60 years old or have a physical disability and live within Bridgeville Borough, you are eligible to participate in the Snow Angel Program. Due to the demand of this program, we ask that you only apply if you have a definite need and you do not have the financial means, or friends or family in the area to assist with snow removal.

ZONING TIDBIT

Turning your home or property into a short-term rental such as Airbnb or Vrbo is only permitted in the Borough's Mixed Use Zoning Districts and not in the Residential districts. An Occupancy Permit for this use is required to be obtained before this use can start and the short-term rental needs to be registered with the Allegheny County Treasurer.

Actions of the last Borough Council Meetings:

July 8, 2024

The Council & Mayor:

- Appointed the law firm Campbell Durrant as special legal counsel for the Borough's Pension Plans.
- Authorized the Solicitor to prepare an Ordinance that will create the Bridgeville Borough Shade Tree Commission.
- Authorized the Borough Manager to apply for a state grant that would amend the zoning ordinance to consider creating a Downtown Zoning District.
- Awarded \$167,800 contract for the Center Street Sanitary Sewer Improvements Project to Jet Jack, Inc.

August 12, 2024

The Council & Mayor:

- Authorized AGI to complete crack filling and asphalt sealing of the McLaughlin Run Park

sports courts

- Authorized the transfer of the 2023 General Fund Surplus to Capital and Reserve Funds.
- Authorized JR Contracting to pave the remaining sections of Center Street after the PAWC water main replacement project.



- Bridgeville-South Fayette Rotary Club presented a \$7,500 donation to the Borough Council for the McLaughlin Run Park Meadow Project.
- Authorized Salandro Contracting to make improvements to the storm sewer inlet on Station Street adjacent to the railroad

crossing at a cost to not exceed \$13,900.

- Partnered with Upper St. Clair Township and authorized Trans Associates to complete a roundabout traffic analysis, conceptual plan and construction estimate for the Mayview Road / Bank St. / Lesnett Road / Chartiers St. intersection.

September 9, 2024

The Council & Mayor:

- Entered into a renewed five-year winter maintenance agreement with PENNDOT for snow removal on state roads in Bridgeville.
- Authorized the Manager to apply for a grant to upgrade the baseball field lighting at Chartiers Park.
- Adopted an Ordinance that prohibits the use of truck engine retarders ("Jake Brakes") on McLaughlin Run Road.
