partnership with the Borough, are currently upgrading the handicapaccessible sidewalk ramps on Bank Street. As part of this project, they are also constructing bump-outs at the intersections of Gregg Avenue and Winfield Street. A bump-out is a traffic calming feature that extends the curb and sidewalk into the roadway, narrowing the road at the intersection. This design helps to make pedestrians more visible to drivers by providing a safer, protected area with a shorter crossing distance.

Construction of the Gregg Avenue an essential connection steps, between Laurel Street, McLaughlin Run Road, and Greenwood Place, will begin in late April and continue through June. This project is funded in part by a state grant, which covers 70% of the costs.
