A SouthBridge EMS subscription helps offset the cost of emergency ambulance transport while supporting your local EMS service. With a subscription, residents receive:

- A 50% reduction on co-pays, co-insurance, and deductibles
- Free treatment with no transport
- Three free lift assists per subscription year

With the average ambulance transport costing approximately \$1,400, a subscription can provide significant financial savings in the event of a 911 emergency.

Actions of the last Borough Council Meetings

January 5, 2026

The Council & Mayor:

- Reorganized and elected Justine Cimarrilli as Council President and Nick Ciesielski as Vice President.
- Reappointed the Borough Solicitor, Borough Engineer and made appointments to the Zoning Hearing Board, Civil Service Commission, Shade Tree Commission and Vacancy Board.
- Directed the Civil Service Commission to initiate testing procedures for Police Sergeant promotions.
- Authorized the purchase of a dump truck body and snow plow equipment.
- Hired Jeremy Haffenden as Public Works Laborer / Equipment Operator

February 9, 2026

The Council & Mayor:

- Authorized the Borough Manager to apply for a state grant to replace the field lighting at Chartiers Park.
- Awarded \$78,290 contract to Roto-Rooter Plumbing for the 2026 Sanitary Sewer O&M CCTV Program.
- Authorized holding Bridgeville Day on the Avenue on Saturday, June 20th.
- Authorized the purchase of a Story Walk Trail Sign using Rotary Club Grant Funding.
- Authorized the Borough Engineer to prepare specifications and advertise for public bids for the 2026 Road Paving Program.
- Authorized engaging services with Cohen Law Group to renew the Verizon Cable Franchise Agreement.

- Authorized engaging services of Traffic, Planning and Design to complete traffic engineering to improve the north-end of Washington Avenue in partnership with Collier Township.

March 9, 2026

The Council & Mayor:

- Authorized the public display of proposed Ordinance No. 1035 that will prohibit the on-street parking and storage of trailers and unregistered & uninspected motor vehicles.
- Entered into agreement to lease sculptures from Seward Johnson Atelier.
- Authorized the Borough Manager to apply for a Main Streets Allegheny Grant to purchase a permanent sculpture exhibit to be displayed on Washington Avenue.
