Members of Council and Mayor,

This report will summarize activity since our last meeting.

### **CAPITAL PROJECTS:**

- See attached detailed Project Update Log. Updates for the month are noted in red font.

### **ADMINISTRATION AND FINANCE:**

- Grant Projects (Grant Log Attached):
  - 2026 DCNR Grant for the Chartiers Park Field Lighting Project: working on application that is seeking \$290,050; project cost estimates have increased to \$580,100. Support letters received from Representative Kulik, Senator Fontana, BAA, Police Department, and County Councilman Bob Palmosina.
  - 2026 DCED GTRP Application underway also seeking funding for the Chariters Park Lighting Project.
  - County Main Street Grant application submitted seeking \$37,500 for a permanent sculpture to commemorate the Borough's 125<sup>th</sup> anniversary to be displayed on Washington Ave.
  - FEMA BRIC Grant for the McLaughlin Run Flood Control Project:
    - FEMA BRIC – the State reports that FEMA has contacted PEMA regarding the resumption of the BRIC program and review of the applications previously submitted for the FY 2022 and 2023 application cycles. Our project was a selected 2022 project.
- Insurance Claims / Matters:
  - The Safety Committee met on March 19, 2026. Workplace Wellness Program is now underway.
- New resident packets sent to all new home buyers for the prior month, information based off real estate transfer records.
- Responded to two Right to Know Requests: Building Permit records and 2025 bill lists.
- 2025 Audit: work continues on the annual audit. DCED report completed and submitted to the state on 4/1/26. Auditor to present final report at the May 11<sup>th</sup> Council Meeting.
- 2026 Borough Guide – has been completed and was mailed to all households.
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter Newsletter – drafted and it will be mailed out with garbage bills the week of 4/13/26.
- Represented the Borough at the annual Tax Collection Committee Meeting on March 12<sup>th</sup>.
- Attended a municipal managers meeting with Visit Pittsburgh on March 17<sup>th</sup> regarding the upcoming NFL Draft.
- Attended the quarterly Route 50 meeting that was held here in Bridgeville on March 18
- Represented the Borough at the annual Chartiers Valley District Flood Control Authority Meeting on March 19<sup>th</sup>.
- Administrative staff participated in a Cyber Security webinar training on March 25.

### **CODE ENFORCEMENT / ZONING / PLANNING:**

- Detailed Zoning / Code Enforcement report attached summarizing complaints, permits and affairs.
- Attended March 23<sup>rd</sup> Planning Commission Meeting. PC reviewed and recommended approval without conditions for Pittsburgh Pottery to operate a Light Manufacturing facility at 414 Margaret Street.

**PUBLIC WORKS:**

- 2026 Sanitary Sewer O&M Project got started on April 8<sup>th</sup>, working on Missouri Avenue. Pre-construction meeting was held on March 12<sup>th</sup>.
- Peoples Gas Co is replacing gas mains on Grandview Avenue, Bank St. between Winfield and Elm, and Spruce Street. Attended pre-construction coordination meeting on March 27
- Street Opening Restoration inspections completed and all utility companies given notice to restore streets and right of ways.
- 2026 Road Program – bid opening was held on April 7<sup>th</sup>. 8 bids received, lowest bid was Youngblood Paving for Sarah St., Missouri Avenue and half of Lurry St.

**PUBLIC SAFETY:**

- 2027 Police CBA Negotiations have started. The negotiating committee (Borough Manager, Council President, Chairman of Public Safety and Finance) is to meet with the Police Officers in mid-April.

**PARKS AND RECREATION:**

- Participated in Day on the Avenue Committee Meeting on March 30<sup>th</sup>. Event planning is going great.
- Construction of the new Chartiers Park Shelter No.1 is progressing well and is on track to be completed by the end of April.
- Drafted the 2026 Park Maintenance Plan and reviewed with the Public Works crews and Committee Chairman.
- Attended the annual Easter Egg Hunt on March 28<sup>th</sup>, event was well attended and a success.
- All park restrooms and drinking fountains have had water service restored for the season.

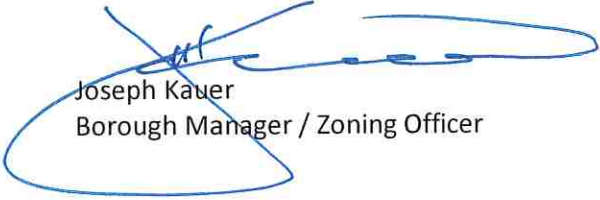

### MONTHLY REPORT: APRIL 2026

- Curbside brush collection underway, started April 7<sup>th</sup> and will be collected through May 1<sup>st</sup>.
- Weekly Street Sweeping underway through May 1<sup>st</sup>. After May 1, it will be performed the third week of each month and business districts every Wednesday morning.
- Grass cutting of Borough properties, right of ways and lots is now underway for the season.
- Park Maintenance:
  - Installed a large section of storm sewer behind McLaughlin Run Park Shelter No. 1 that catches overflow from the waterfall area to prevent flooding within the adjacent shelter.
  - Minor flooding occurred in Chartiers Park on March 30<sup>th</sup>, DPW cleaned up the following days.
  - Water service has been restored to all park restroom buildings and drinking fountains for the season.
  - Grass cutting and winter clean-up has been completed in each park.
- Storm Sewer Maintenance:
  - Constructed catch basins on Missouri Avenue and Pennsylvania Ave.
- Business District Maintenance:
  - Assisted Public Art Bridgeville and relocated a sculpture from Triangle Park to the Library and removed the Mailman sculpture from the Borough Building.
- Truck Maintenance:
  - Truck 5 – pulley assembly replaced
  - Truck 7 – transmission lines and pan replaced
- Sign Maintenance – replaced damaged signs, straightened poles, refaced faded stop signs and added missing speed limit signs throughout town.

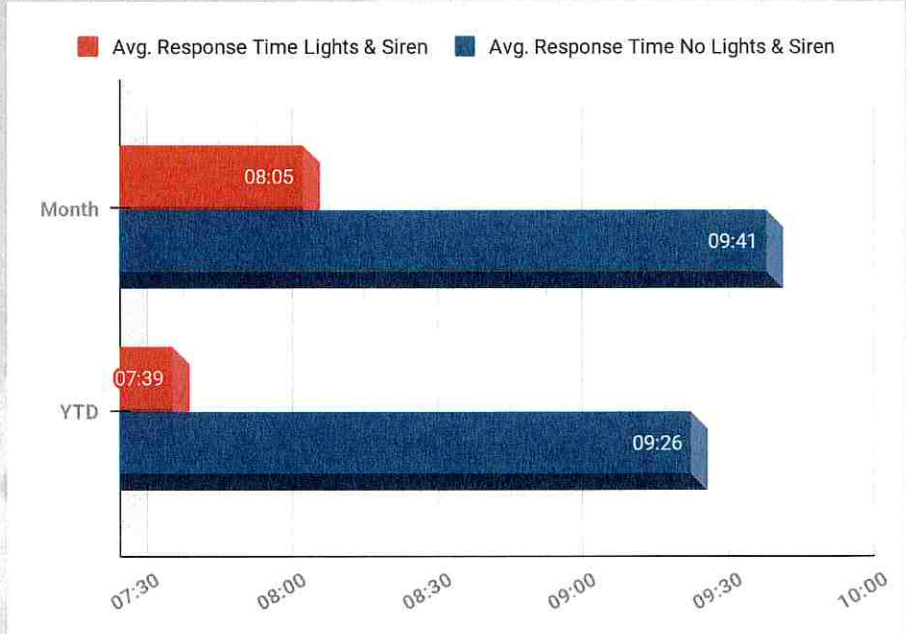

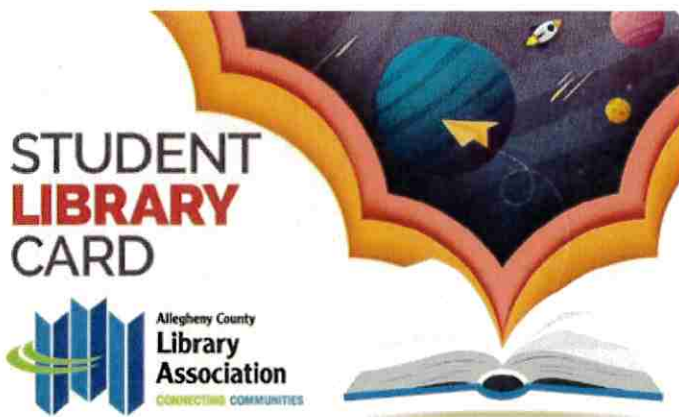
Partnered with Chartiers Valley School District and Allegheny County Library Association on a School Library Card Initiative, issuing a card to every student in the district

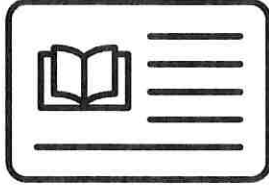

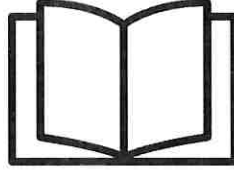

## CHILDREN'S OUTREACH

Our Children's Outreach Specialist visited thirteen local preschools, daycares, and afterschool programs every month last year, providing fun literacy programs and bringing the library's services out into the community.

In addition, our Family & Youth Services Librarian partnered with Chartiers Valley School District to provide preschool STEAM programs, co-hosted the annual CVIS / CVMS Battle of the Books events, and visited the schools for family night programs.

We hosted special presenters throughout summer like My Favorite Sweet Shoppe and Pittsburgh Center for Creative Reuse and teens also enjoyed a monthly Teen After Hours program. Themes included: Clue Murder Mystery, Mario Party, and Black Light Paint Night.

In total, 35 tween and teen programs were held at the library, and 291 people attended them.



# Adult Programs

This year, the library hosted its first annual Adult Battle of the Books Fundraiser. This event, sponsored by Dee Jay's BBQ Ribs and Grille, saw six teams pitted against each other in a friendly game of book trivia competition.



In 2025, the library once again partnered with the Amateur Astronomer Association of Pittsburgh to provide a star party, where attendees could view the wonders of space through telescopes.

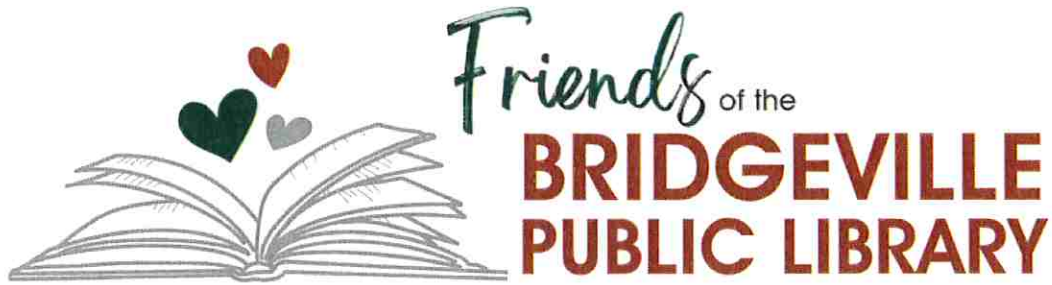


Another special partnership was the summer movies on the patio with Pittsburgh Classic Movie Club. We look forward to hosting them again this year!
