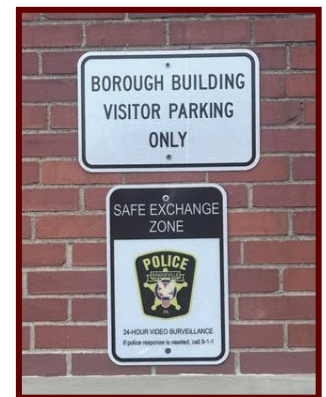


Chartiers Park Newest Picnic Shelter Ready for your next gathering!

Safe Exchange Zone Created at Borough Building

The Bridgeville Police Department is joining law enforcement agencies across the country in offering a designated Safe Exchange Zone for the community. This space is intended to provide a secure location for transactions such as internet sales and child custody exchanges. The Safe Exchange Zone is located at the Borough Building on the Carol Avenue side and consists of two clearly marked, well-lit parking spaces under video surveillance.



Bridgeville Named a 2026 Banner Community

The Borough of Bridgeville has been recognized as a 2026 Banner Community by the County Executive and the Allegheny League of Municipalities (ALOM). The program recognizes municipalities that show a commitment to professional development, prudent fiscal management, transparency, accountability, and proactive communications to engage community stakeholders.

In order to be eligible for consideration for the Banner Communities Program, the municipality's elected and appointed officials must:

- Participate in educational or training programs through ALOM, the Local Government Academy or the PA Department of Community & Economic Development or participate in a governing mentoring program.
- Be active members in good standing with ALOM and the county municipal associations, and have a representative attending at least a minimum of 50% of county association meetings.
- Be active members in good standing in a Council of Governments (COG) and attend COG meetings, participate in a COG cooperative purchasing program and participate in at least one shared municipal service.
- Conduct a Local Government Week activity by conducting a local activity promoting local government or communicating with the community about delivery of services.
- Conduct an effective Citizen Communication Program by offering a municipal newsletter or web-based communication effort.
- Promote and implement long term sustainable governing practices by earning certification through Sustainable Pittsburgh, managing employee pensions at funding levels of 90% or above, participating in the annual ALOM Wage and Salary Survey Program, and implementing goals of an up-to-date Municipal Comprehensive Plan.

chemicals or household hazardous waste. Those materials are collected at the July 22th event.

Actions of the last Borough Council Meetings

April 13, 2026

The Council & Mayor:

- Adopted Ordinance No. 1035, that prohibited the parking of trailers and unregistered or dismantled motor vehicles on public streets.
- Awarded 2026 Road Paving Project to Youngblood Paving, Inc. in the amount of \$331,312 to resurface Sarah St., Missouri Avenue and half of Lurry Street.
- Designated the Tribune Review and Post Gazette as newspapers of record to advertise Borough official notices.
- Authorized R&R Masonry Restoration to complete masonry repairs and general repointing work on the Borough Building.
- Approved 2025 Volunteer Firefighter Earned Income Tax Credits for eligible Bridgeville firefighters.

May 11, 2026

The Council & Mayor:

- Issued a Conditional Use Permit for

Pittsburgh Pottery to operate a Light Manufacturing facility at 414 Margaret Street.

- Recognized the youth who participated in the Earth Day Cleanup Event.
- Accepted the 2025 Borough Audit Report.
- Authorized the Borough Manager to apply for a grant to upgrade field lighting at Chartiers Park.
- Adopted the 2026 Allegheny County Hazard Mitigation Plan as the official Hazard Mitigation Plan for the Borough.
- Authorized seeking an Pennsylvania LCB Noise Exemption for the Crafty Jackalope so that they follow the Borough's Noise Ordinance versus the LCB regulation.
- Awarded contract to Youngblood Paving, Inc. in the amount of \$81,356 to pave half of Public Parking Lot No. 2 (approved and to be reimbursed by the Parking Authority.)

June 8, 2026

The Council & Mayor:

- Promoted Patrolman Roman Williams to the rank of Police Sergeant.
- Approved a Civil Service Rules amendment that would change the name of the rank of Police Sergeant to Police Lieutenant.
- Authorized the submission of two ALCOSAN Green Revitalization of our Waterways Program Grants to make improvements within the McLaughlin Run sewershed.
- Purchased a jackhammer for the Public Works Department excavator.
- Accepted the base bid received from N&N Landscaping in the amount of \$43,970 for the 2026 ADA Improvements Project to upgrade sidewalk ramps on Station Street.
- Approved land development plans to construct a parking lot at 501-509 Washington Ave.
